1. Matthias St. John,
Sension or Sention, the
first of this name whom
we can trace in Am.
was born in England,
came to Dorchester, Mass.
in 1631-2, & was made
a freeman there on
Sept. 3, 1634. He received
a grant of 20 acres in
Dorchester Jan. 14, 1635,
"at the bounds betwixt
Roxbury and Dorchester".

On Mar. 18 1637 he
owned 3 acres, 2 goods, &
3 rods in the neck of
Dorchester, & 2 acres, 1 good,
& 4 rods in the cow pasture.

He moved to Windsor
Conn. in 1640. where
he had granted him

Matthias St. John (2).

Home lot was No. 25
near the Cove. In 1665
his lands + accomodation
were valued at £ 150.

He was selectman of
Norwalk.

Matthias Sention, Jr.

In 1692 Matthias Sention
Sr. deceded to his son James
land called "Stichey Plains"

Under "Care Marks" -

"Matthias Sention" Slyp
cut oft of the inside of
the neck and a slit
right down oft the
oft ear." May 30, 1655.

granted to Matthias
St. John some lot No. 16,

June 28, 1712.

Capt. Samuel St. John came
from Norwalk with
his brother Matthew +
his father, and was
the an original proprietor
of Ridgefield, Sept, 1708,
when 24 persons bot
the land from the Indians.
In 1709 they took possession
of this 20,000 acres +
divided them into lots,
of which Nat. fell to
Capt. St. John. He was
made Sergeant in 1708.

in 1775 and served
nearly 7 years, until
honorably discharged
